

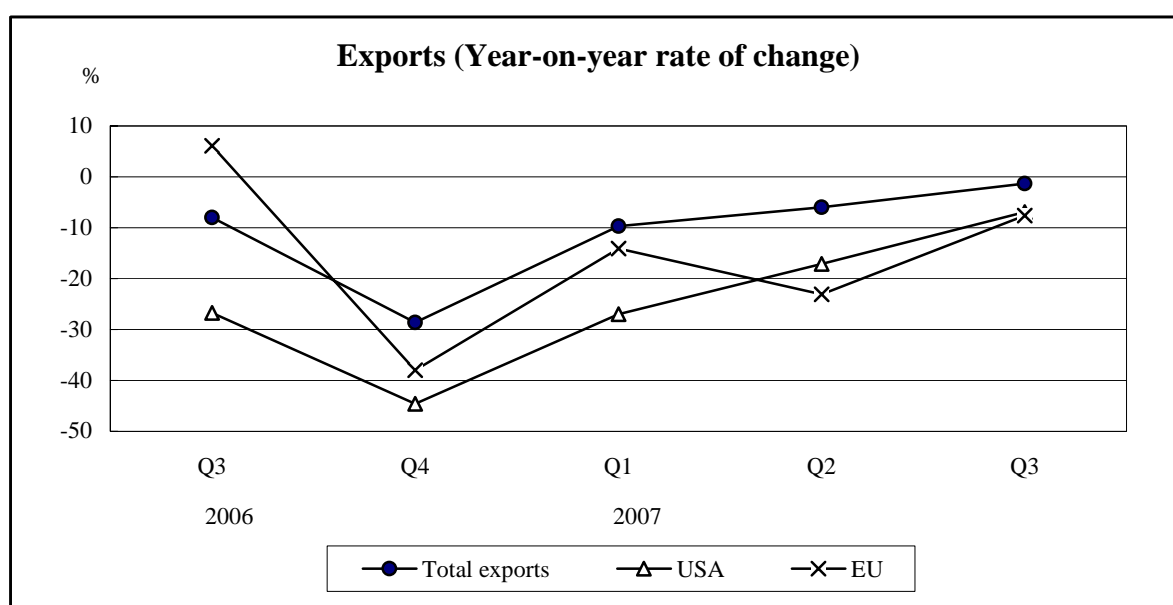
# External Trade of Macao in the Third Quarter of 2007 <sup>a</sup>

## A. External Trade

### Imports and Exports of Goods

In the third quarter of 2007, value of external trade of Macao increased by 12.3% to MOP 16.91 billion, up from MOP 15.06 billion in the same period of 2006. Imports rose by 20.1% to MOP 11.49 billion, higher than the 8.8% growth in the third quarter of 2006. Exports shrank by 1.3% to MOP 5.43 billion, as against an 8.0% drop in the corresponding period of 2006. The exports-imports ratio fell from 57.5% in the third quarter of 2006 to 47.3% in this quarter, whereas the trade deficit widened by 49.0% year-on-year from MOP 4.07 billion to MOP 6.06 billion.

As regards the major markets of Macao's merchandise exports, value of exports to the US, the EU and Mainland China amounted to MOP 2.18 billion, MOP 1.04 billion and MOP 765 million, down by 6.9%, 7.6% and 3.6% respectively, while exports to Hong Kong grew by 14.9% to MOP 727 million. In terms of types of goods exported, clothing and other textile products remained the major merchandise of Macao's exports, its value of exports dropped by 6.6% and the share in the total reduced to 67.4%, down by 3.7 percentage points from 71.1% in the third quarter of 2006. Nevertheless, the value of other exports rose by 11.9%.

## **Domestic Exports**

Domestic exports made up 67.8% of total value of exports in the third quarter, amounting to MOP 3.68 billion, down by 5.3%, while narrowing from the 16.3% drop logged in the third quarter of 2006. Value of clothing and other textile products, which made up 87.8% of the total domestic exports, went down by 4.2%. Among them, the value of exports to the US and the EU declined by 6.4% and 8.8% respectively.

Domestic exports were still concentrated in the formerly restricted textile and garment products, whose value diminished by 2.1% to occupy 77.6% of the total value of domestic exports. Among this, value of exports to the US and EU decreased by 0.7% and 5.4% respectively. On the other hand, domestic exports of the formerly unrestricted garment and textile products declined by 17.5%.

In terms of non-textile products, value of exports of footwear dropped by 8.3% to share 2.8% of the total value of domestic exports. Exports of machinery, apparatus and parts, sharing merely 0.1% of the total value of domestic exports, fell continuously by 74.4%.

In addition, results of the Industrial Export Survey for the third quarter of 2007 revealed that the average length of time of the orders on hand of the interviewed manufacturers was 3.1 months, up by 14.8% against the 2.7 months for the third quarter of 2006. Among the interviewed manufacturers, those anticipating slight and substantial growth in the coming six months was 32.8% and 5.5% respectively, while 23.4% were pessimistic and 38.3% predicted stagnant growth.

## **Re-exports**

Re-exports expanded by 8.4% to MOP 1.75 billion in the third quarter, accounting for 32.2% of the total value of exports. Mainland China was the largest market of Macao's re-exports, constituting 39.1% of the total and Hong Kong took up 33.5%; however, value of re-exports to Mainland China declined by 4.4% whereas that to Hong Kong grew by 15.1%.

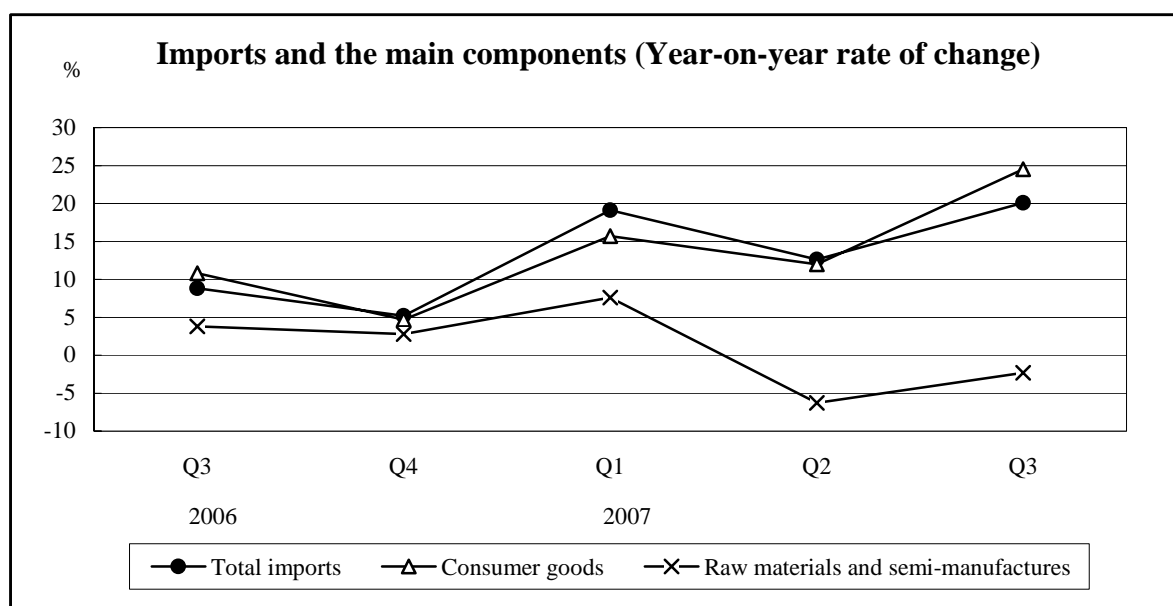
In terms of the types of goods, the main merchandise of re-exports was raw materials & semi-manufactures, with value of re-exports decreased by 2.9% to take up 37.8% of the total. Re-exports of capital goods soared by 81.1%, but consumer goods and fuels & lubricants dropped by 11.9% and 1.1% respectively.

## **Imports**

Value of imports went up by 20.1% in the third quarter to MOP 11.49 billion. Mainland China continued to be the largest source of imports to Macao, and the respective value of imports expanded

by 11.0% to take up 42.9% of the total value of imports. As regards other suppliers of Macao's imports, the value of imports from the EU, Hong Kong, Japan, and the US increased by 42.9%, 23.9%, 29.2% and 16.2% respectively.

In terms of types of goods imported, consumer goods, the major merchandise that made up 41.7% of the total value of imports, rose by 24.5%. This was followed by raw materials & semi-manufactures, which dropped by 2.3% to occupy 25.3% of the total value of imports. Meanwhile, imports of capital goods (20.2% of the total) and fuels & lubricants (12.8%) expanded by 50.1% and 23.1%.
